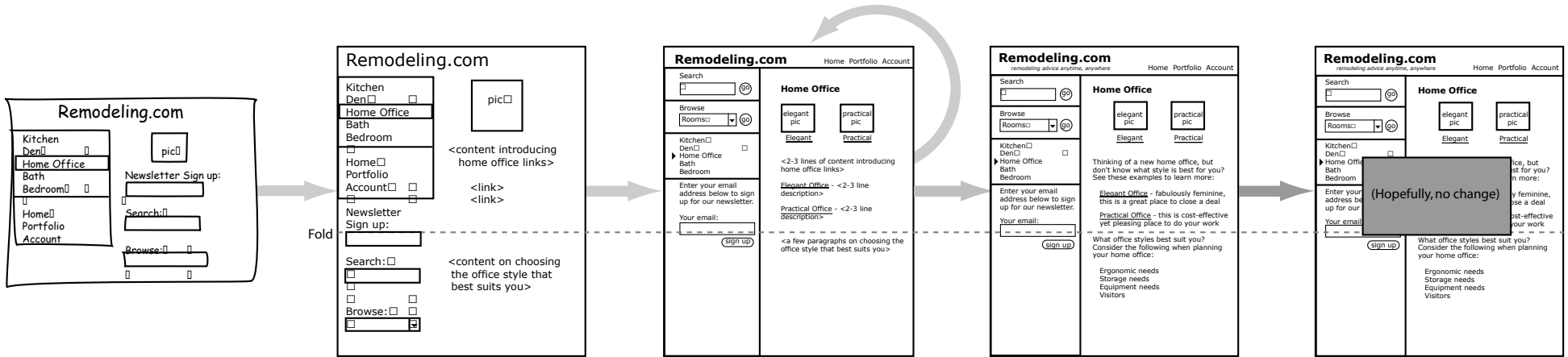

Sketch Concept

Purpose

To make a first attempt at capturing ideas for a page's user interface

Description

Ideally, while working on Page Flows, we'll start sketching page schematics.

What's Included

- Ideas for:
- Navigation & organization
 - Fields, buttons, & labels
 - Types of graphics & content

Who

- Interaction Designer leads
- Can be shared with Content Specialist, Design Scientist, Visual Designer, Usability Specialist, Business Analyst, etc.

Create Schematic

Purpose

To discuss and flesh out page details with the team

Description

We create the initial page schematic in electronic form.

What's Included

- Suggestions for navigation and organization, fields, buttons & labels
- Placeholders for graphics and content

Who

- Interaction Designer leads
- Can be shared with Content Specialist, Design Scientist, Visual Designer, Usability Specialist, Business Analyst, etc.

Refine Schematic

Purpose

To finalize the nomenclature, static content/text, layout, organization, navigation and structure based on usability testing and on the visual direction

Description

This is an iterative process that includes:

- Updating the layout to match the visual direction
- Usability testing the layout, organization and navigation
- Revising & finalizing the layout, organization and navigation

What's Included (by end)

- Final layout with:
 - Space allocated for content & graphics
 - Graphics that clarify interaction
 - Line wrap behavior clear
- Final static content/text for:
 - Fields, labels & buttons
 - Instructions
 - Error messages
 - Dropdown list

Who

- Interaction Designer owns, responsible for consistency
- Visual Design input crucial

Add Content

Purpose

To efficiently specify the content for the page

Description

When developing content, it's critical to understand how the content will fit in the page. Putting the content into the schematic helps ensure the content is the appropriate length to fit in the layout.

What's Included

- Any layout changes to keep in sync with the Visual Design Templates
- Content that's reviewed and edited in the context of the page

Who

- Interaction Designer or perhaps Content Specialist synchs up with a Visual Designer
- Content Specialist or writer adds content

Finalize

Purpose

To communicate the final page design & content to colleagues who have not been involved in the Design Phase; can be used to check implemented pages

Description

It's important to document last minute changes in page design & content to avoid confusion later on down the line. Keeping the schematic consistent with how the implementation is supposed to look should also make life easier for those testing the site.

What's Included

- Updates to address:
- Usability and other bugs
 - Last minute design changes

Who

- Interaction Designer or perhaps Content Specialist or UX Lead
